

PA Age One Connect the Dots 1.5 Continuing Education Units for Dental Professionals

This course supports the current standard of care and national recommendations educating dental providers about the importance of "Knee-to-Knee" examinations, dental visits before Age 1, serving young children in their practices, increasing productivity by accepting referrals from medical providers who are advising families to visit a dentist and billing for preventive services to avoid early childhood caries.

Introduction to Cavity Free Kids Curriculum 1.5 CEUs for Dental Professionals

This overview presents oral health as an ongoing part of preschool education and includes classroom activities and educational materials for use in parent meetings and home visits. Cavity Free Kids was developed for Head Start and Early Learning Programs, but has since been expanded to include all people in the community who work with children, motivating all care providers to work with community groups to improve oral health literacy.

Smiles! Oral Health for Everyone: An Introduction to Oral Health for Community Health Workers No CEUs available

Community Health Workers and Health Educators can help to improve oral health because they are already trusted members of the community and understand community needs; they promote prevention and manage chronic diseases for the rest of the body. This course provides training for these advocates, empowering them to be valuable resources for oral health information for individuals and families.

Oral Health Through the Lifespan 1.0 CEU for Medical Professionals

This course addresses the impact of dental disease throughout several life stages including pregnancy, childhood, middle age and senior adulthood. Developed as an educational aid for health care professionals interested in learning more about the link between oral health and overall health, the webinar shows how medical dental integration contributes to comprehensive and high-quality care for all patients and provides tools to promote oral health.

Caring for the Oral Health of Persons with Special Needs NOTE: Continuing Education Units for Dental Professionals are in process

This comprehensive series of webinars includes targeted modules for a variety of audiences, including Oral Health Professionals, Allied Health Professionals, Care Givers and Individuals with Special Needs. Webinar topics include: Oral Health Basics, Understanding and Addressing Medical Complications in the Oral Care Plan, Non-Pharmacological Behavior Management Techniques, and Medical Immobilization and Protective Stabilization (MIPS) Techniques, among others.
