The standard protocol for dental treatment of a pregnant patient includes:	
Necessary radiographs using a double lead shield over the abdomen and thyroid.	
• Restorative and prophylaxis care (including scaling and root planing if necessary), and or extractions.	
Local anesthetic, 2% lidocaine.	
If antibiotic is needed, Category B drugs such as amoxicillin, erythromycin, cephalosporins.	
• If non-narcotic pain management is needed, Category B drugs such as over-the-counter acetaminophen may be used.	
• If narcotic pain management is needed, acetaminophen with codeine #3 during first and second trimesters.	
Oral rinse chlorhexidine gluconate 0.12%.	
Prescribed preventive agents such as PreviDent, Fluoridex, and Clinpro dentifrices.
